

Registry Fees

- Participating facilities pay a one-time registration fee of \$500
- Annual participation fees are scaled to the number of imaging physicians and sites
- Number of imaging physicians is a proxy for practice size (see tables below)
- Registration is required for each site of a multi-location facility

CMS Reporting Pricing

- ACR members: \$199 per physician per year
- Nonmembers: \$1,299 per physician per year
- SIR members: Please contact SIR for special discount coupons

Interventional Radiology Registry

Optimize interventional radiology (IR) patient care with the new national quality IR registry from the American College of Radiology (ACR) and the Society of Interventional Radiology (SIR).

The Interventional Radiology Registry helps imaging facilities improve quality of patient care by providing participants with access to accurate and objective measures regarding the quality of facility processes and outcomes in comparison to similar facilities nationwide.

As part of the ACR National Radiology Data Registry (NRDR®), this registry will develop benchmarks and support performance improvement using structured reporting templates.



Benefits of IR Registry Participation

- Report measures to CMS for the Quality Payment Program/MIPS
- Compare your results to regional and national benchmarks for quality improvement
- Collect performance measures for image-guided interventional procedures
- Receive reports based on aggregated benchmarks to facilitate patient safety and quality improvement efforts
- Meet ABR Part 4 MOC Credit requirements

IR Registry Participation Basics

- Register to participate at acr.org/nrdp
- For groups already in NRDR, submit an addendum for the IR registry
- Implement SIR structured reporting templates into your reporting system and process
- Visit the Practice Resources section of sirweb.org for templates, user's guide and video tutorial
- Coordinate with NRDR staff to install ACR software locally for registry data element submission via HL7 messaging
- Reporting template standardized data received via HL7 interface will be used for IR quality measure calculations
- Use IR Registry performance feedback reports on a quarterly basis

Measure List

- CVC History: Assessment of risk factors prior to difficult central venous access procedures
- Appropriate venous access for tunneled hemodialysis catheters
- Uterine artery embolization technique: Documentation of angiographic endpoints and interrogation of ovarian arteries
- Rate of early peristomal infection following fluoroscopically guided gastrostomy tube placement
- Rate of percutaneous nephrostomy tube replacement within 30 days secondary to dislodgement
- Traditional PQRS/MIPS measures are also included in the IR Registry for CMS reporting
